ADHD Coaching WORKS! Here on DI MOSQuito mayhem keeps abatement crews buzzing

Unless you've managed to stay indoors these last few weeks, chances are you've felt the sting of mosquito mania on Daniel Island. The mad dash from the house to the mailbox and back to avoid prolonged exposure, the swarm of tiny black clouds around players and families on athletic fields, and leisurely walks that turn into sprints after multiple bites by the pesky predators.

The local mosquito abatement militia is aware of our pain - and they have been working diligently to do something about it. But, as history often reminds us, Mother Nature can be a powerful foe.

"Sometimes Mother Nature creates a perfect recipe for mosquito hatch-offs," said Jeff Cary, Director of Berkeley County Mosquito Abatement. "And that's what we have right now."

Many residents have taken to Facebook to express that this feels like "the worst year" in more than a decade for mosquitos on the island. There may be some truth to that, but according to Cary, every year stands alone. The season's recent extreme high tides combined with plentiful rain and a vast dredge spoil area on the island's southern tip have created ideal mosquito breeding conditions.

"Spoil sites are the primary problem," Cary said. "They generate tremendously more numbers than your salt marsh sites, but with the high tides and rain, we're getting hatch offs from both the salt marsh and the spoil sites."

And those hatch-offs have been so frequent that Cary and his crews have had a hard time keeping up. Another hatch-off late in the week prompted a second aerial spray on Sunday. Berkeley County conducts abatement services for the residential areas of Daniel Island, Thomas Island and Clements Ferry Road, while Charleston County handles aerial spraying on the dredge spoil sites.

The main components of Berkeley County's "integrated pest management program" are inspection and surveillance; mosquito larvicide, which involves finding out where breeding sites are and treating the water; and adulticide, a truck application of an ultra low volume spray consisting of micronsized droplets designed to kill the bugs on contact. The chemical Berkeley County uses for ground spraying by truck to com-

bat mosquitoes is pyrethroid, a synthetic version of the pyrethrin found naturally in the chrysanthemum plant. The low toxicity product does not pose a risk to humans. said Cary.

For aerial spraying (which is not conducted over residential areas), a chemical known as "naled." an active ingredient in Dibrom Concentrate and Trumpet EC, is typically used. This product, administered at a low rate, is "highly effective and poses minimal exposure risks to people, animals and the environment," according to information provided to The Daniel Island News by Charleston County Mosquito Control.

A low-flying spray plane was observed by several families last Thursday night as they gathered on an athletic field behind the Daniel Island School, as well as on fields utilized by the Daniel Island Soccer Academy. A resident sent an email to The Daniel Island News expressing concerns about the "manner and timing of how the airplane was flying." According to Berkeley County Councilman Josh Whitley, the plane did not belong to Berkeley County.

"We go to great lengths to do it at a time that is least impactful," he said, "Which is weekends at daybreak. We were supposed to fly last Saturday and we pushed it back to Sunday because of the (9/11 Heroes Run) race. We are very cognizant of that.'

Charleston County Mosquito Control Manager Frank Carson did not witness the incident in question, but said that aerial spraying conducted on that particular evening was done over the dredge disposal

New DI Performing Arts Center in the works

Broadway-caliber productions may soon take center stage on Daniel Island. It was announced at the September 9 Daniel Island Speakers Series event that a Performing Arts Center is in the works for the island. Daniel Island Business Association (DIBA) President Pete Harper told those in attendance for the program that plans are underway to bring a 450-seat, state-of-the art theatre to a parcel of land along River Landing Drive behind the UBS Building.

"It's a vision at this point," said Harper. "But I think with a lot of hard work and some time that will be put into it, it can definitely become a reality.'

Harper later confirmed that the land for the center is currently under contract with the Daniel Island Company. A commercial real estate agent who helped secure the property, Harper said the visionary behind the project is Mary Gould, founder and producer of the South of Broadway Theatre Company. According to brochures and flyers shared by Gould at an information table at

the event, the center is to be a civic venue accommodating entertainment, business meetings, and educational activities for the Daniel Island Community. Planners are hoping the Performing Arts Center will become a "landmark destination" on the island that will not only attract theater patrons from the Charleston region, but from the state and nation as well.

"It's brand new," added Harper, who said that DIBA is '100 percent' behind the project. "It's only been a couple of weeks that we've really started to work on this. But it's really exciting!" Marigold Arts Development, Inc., operat-

ing as the South of Broadway Theatre Company (SBTC), is listed as the developer of the project. The SBTC, currently located in the Park Circle community in North Charleston, would be the new facility's main tenant. Plans call for a large "proscenium" theatre, a 99-seat "black box" theatre, and combined indoor lobby and outdoor plaza gathering spaces for the public. Look for more details on the project in future issues of The Daniel Island News.

"There will be tons of families of people with Down syndrome, it will be a fun day and the kids will all have a blast," she shares, "but it feels like they are there just for my family. I feel like the students are all saying to me, 'It's OK. We are Joe's friends and we've got his back.' No feeling like it. They

will lift me up all year and not even realize they have done it."



Anita Zucker share's family story steeped in survival, love, hard work and charity

As a young girl in Nazi-controlled Poland, Rose Goldberg found herself fighting for survival. She and her family had been living in a Labor Camp set up by the Nazi's. When troops came to cleanse the "Ghetto," she fell behind a straw mattress and kept still. They didn't find her.

Rose managed to escape and later caught up with her two younger brothers, who had already successfully managed to get their mother off a transport truck to safety. Then, she found her 18 month old niece, alive and seemingly forgotten in a corner. Together, they would all survive the Holocaust.

Goldberg's courageous efforts during one of the world's most horrific events would have a lasting impact, not only on her own life, but on the lives of others in her family. Perhaps most notably, her daughter, Anita Goldberg Zucker, who credits her mother, now almost 92 years old, with being her greatest teacher.

"She's got an amazing strength and a dedication that binds us to this day," said Zucker, an acclaimed Charleston businesswoman and philanthropist, who served as the featured speaker at the Daniel Island Speaker Series September 9 event at the Daniel Island Club. "...She's really quite amazing and I can't say enough about her. The one thing I can tell you is her faith never wavered...She's taught me so much about the values necessary to achieve success."

Dressed in a crisp black dress suit, Zucker used her time at the podium last week to share her life's story with the 250 people in attendance, much of it centering on the influence of her mother. Her late father, Carl, who married her mother after the atrocities of the war had ended, was also a Holocaust survivor.

As Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer of her family's company, The InterTech Group, Inc., Zucker also owns the Carolina

Ice Palace, the original Ms. Rose's Fine Foods and Cocktails in West Ashley (named for her mother), and the South Carolina Sting Rays. She has served on numerous boards, including Trident United Way; the Advisory Board of the Charleston Area HUB for Math, Science and Technology; Trident Technical College Area Commission; the Board of Jewish Studies, Inc.; and the Medical University of South Carolina Foundation. She is a past president of the Rotary Club of Charleston, Charleston Metro Chamber of Commerce, and the Coastal Community Foundation. Zucker has also been the recipient of multiple awards, such as the prestigious "Order of the Palmetto," South Carolina's highest civilian honor; the "Joseph P. Riley Leadership Award"; and the Charleston Jewish Federation's inaugural "Light Unto

Zucker and her late husband, Jerry, started InterTech in 1982, after moving to the Charleston area in 1978. While speaking to her Daniel of her marriage to Jerry, who passed away after a battle with cancer in 2008. They began

to cultivate what would later become a highly successful business model while living as college students in Florida, both working to put themselves through school.

"When I turned 18, I married Jerry Zucker, and life began," she said. "...We owned a delicatessen and a record store...and in the afternoons when we finished the paying jobs and the classes, we would go cook. We prepared foods that were being served while we were busy working or going to school. It was really an interesting time."

The couple learned the benefits of hard work early on, and success followed soon after.

"...We made sacrifices, but no challenge was too great," said Zucker, "We were building a foundation and would eventually discover success in business and that success would unveil opportunities to improve the lives of others, through giving and community service. So over the years as our businesses grew so did our opportunity to give back."

Several decades later, the Zucker family's InterTech Group is one of America's largest private companies with some 15,000 employees and an estimated worth of \$4.2 billion (Forbes, October 2014). Jerry's vision, combined with his continuous efforts to conduct business with honesty, integrity, respect, and fairness, continue to guide the company's

"Our company is family-owned," Zucker said. "What makes it very special is that we have strong business performance and a wonderful committed family...Our family is what it's all about. We all work together, do things together, and we care for each other."

The business is involved in products and services related to aerospace, advanced materials, leisure entertainment, real estate, financial services, manufacturing and alternative energy. Some of their products and investments Island audience, she reflected on the early days include a polymer fiber that keeps firefighters protected longer in extreme heat, soft baits for fisherman, solar farms, beach volleyball in

Canada, and residential and commercial real estate all over the world.

"It makes our industry never boring, and always a lot of fun to see what we're engaged in," Zucker told the audience.

Driving the business's widespread achievements are several "keys to success" created by Jerry, said Zucker. First, always have a sense of urgency and a bias for action.

"As CEO, he made decisions yesterday, I used to make them tomorrow," added Zucker. "I can't do that anymore. I had to change. No more procrastination!"

Also on the list — leading by example and serving as a role model, asking yourself daily if your actions are contributing to increasing company revenues or reducing costs, continuously increasing productivity through better application of methods and technologies, striving for innovation, and providing excellent and consistent customer service.

"Jerry also said if you love your job, you'll never work a day in your life," said Zucker. "I have to tell you, I am really lucky and I love my job. I'm happy to have somewhere to go and something to do every day."

Zucker said she is also very thankful that InterTech remains a privately held company.

"The most important thing is we're very entrepreneurial. As a private company, I can make decisions at the snap of a finger...That's what really differentiates us from a public company. We can do pretty much what we want. I don't have to work to please shareholders, because I am it. That's a nice thing."

An undeniable component of the Zucker family mantra is service, something that Zucker said she and her husband learned from their parents, as well as their faith. Both the company and the family continually seek out ways to provide help to those in need, particularly in areas that enhance the human experience, such as education, health and human needs, the environment and the arts. They have

created a legacy of charitable giving over the years, contributing millions of dollars towards various initiatives both locally and nationally.

"One thing our parents taught us was to give of your time and your talent," she said. "So we began to do that, and today we can give our treasure." The Zucker family has several charitable

foundations, among them the InterTech Foundation, which gives between \$200,000 and \$500,000 in grant funding per year. They have also contributed greatly to educational causes in South Carolina, creating a Zucker Family School of Education at The Citadel, the Zucker Family Graduate Education Center at the Clemson Restoration Institute, and the Zucker Institute for Aerospace Innovation at the University of South Carolina.

"In our religion in the Jewish faith it's expressed as 'Tikkun Olam,' repair of the world, and this is a philosophy that today guides my family and me through our lives," Zucker said. "It's such a vital part of the foundation supporting my personal and professional life."

Making sure today's youth are well educated and equipped to enter the job force is an area Zucker is particularly passionate about. Citing the increasing expansions of new businesses into South Carolina, including Boeing, Volvo, and Daimler Chrysler, the Lowcountry workforce must be prepared with ready skill sets, she said.

"We can change people's lives by giving them the right education," said Zucker, a former educator herself who earned a master's in education from the University of North Florida. "Not everyone has a college degree, but they have the ability to earn a wage. A living wage allows them to become successful as individuals. That's critical to me."

In closing, Zucker shared a favorite quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson. "Do not follow where the path may lead," she recited. "Go instead where there is no path and leave a trail." From Rose Goldberg's journey to freedom so many years ago, to Anita Zucker's own road to prosperity and philanthropy, it's always been about making a difference.

"I believe that great achievement is born from leading by example, and inspiration rather than dictation," said Zucker. "... I spend my time working towards something more important than self...In my religion, it's an obligation. It's an obligation to leave the world a little better than how we found it.'

For Zucker, Rose is still providing that example. Two women, separated by two different worlds of experiences, linked by a common, powerful theme that has become a lasting family legacy.

"Our connection is one of those things that created a driving force within me," said Zucker. "She has played an unbelievably key role in my decisions to become an educator, an entrepreneur, and teaching me about the joys of living, and living to serve."

sites by a contractor they have used many times over the years with experienced pilots. He stated that he did hear from one resident who voiced a complaint about a spray plane flying over island soccer fields. Her concerns were relayed to the contractor, he added, and will be evaluated to see if any changes need to be made in the

"This summer has been unusual." Carson said. "We've had to do aerial spraying for adult mosquitoes four times this year in the Charleston Harbor area, which is more than double the norm. When they fly, they have to go in patterns so they get coverage... and they have to go low enough so we don't get overspray into areas that are not

When it comes to residential and commercial areas on Daniel Island and the Cainhoy Peninsula, Cary and his team remain focused on attacking the mosquito problem as best they can.

When he recently came out to do "landing count rates" in the community, his results varied widely.

"Landing rate counts on Daniel Island were ranging between lows of zero in certain areas...to over 10 per minute with some substantially higher." he said. "In some areas we had over 25 a minute... That's why we decided to elevate from controlling with a spray truck to putting up an aircraft, because aircraft can reach outside of just the roads."

After a recent Saturday spraying, he decided to grab his bike and drive down to the island so he could ride around to do his own assessments. Victory, he discovered, can be short lived.

"I spent four hours on the island." he said. "I carried my bike down there and just rode the trails. I stopped 16 times and did landing rates and was very pleased with the results...But then I came in Tuesday and found out we had another (hatch-off) explosion. It's very upsetting from our standpoint because we think we're doing everything we can and you turn around and they're back in full force."

And if you really want to understand the scope and magnitude of the problem - just do the math. Dredge sites can produce about 40 million mosquitoes per acre, said Cary, per significant rainfall.

"When you look at the tip of Daniel Island, that's about 1000 acres of dredge spoil disposal, and Clouter Creek (off Thomas Island) has about 1800 acres.... Dredge sites will dry out after they flood and will form these giant fissures, or cracks, and they lay eggs in the cracks. In another rainfall the cracks are filled, and that's why they literally come out by the

Cary is hopeful that between his department's efforts and more favorable weather conditions, the problem can be kept from getting worse.

"If we can keep the rainfall down...as temperatures drop it will take longer between life cycles and they are less likely to hatch off as things get colder...I'm praying for a freeze."



DINA 411 - DANIEL ISLAND MOVES CLOSER to upgraded intersection, new park prospects

t the call to order of the September 8 meeting of the Daniel Island Neighborhood Association (DINA), available seating was scant. Leadership had apparently successfully marketed a noteworthy evening, with not-button topics on the table and some elected heavyhitters serving as speakers.

BUT FIRST, SOME COMMITTEE UPDATES...

DINA president Glenn Williman kicked off the meeting by delivering a traffic and safety update. He reminded the group that the most effective way of submitting a traffic- or safetyrelated issue or request is by using the project request form available on the association's website (dineighborhoodassociation.org). Proper submission of these forms has already resulted in numerous changes around the island, including restriping on Seven Farms Drive, as well as several crosswalks and parking spaces. "No parking" triangles will also be installed at Pierce and Smythe Streets, in addition to a speed bump on Blakeway

Land Use and Zoning committee chair Clyde Rush addressed the group, reporting that in the last two weeks alone, the City's Technical Review Committee has reviewed 114 new home construction projects, a testament to the large volume of activity on Daniel Island. Rush also told the group that four "islands within the island" will be rezoned, changing from a Daniel Island Resiadopted. dential designation to that of Daniel Island Residential Island. The primary difference between the two zoning categories is an increase in the maximum height of construction on the inner island properties, allowing for homes in these areas to be built up higher due to flood considerations.

...AND AN INFORMATIVE POLICE BRIEFING

Team 5 Commander Lt. James Byrne spoke briefly about the primary concerns on Daniel Island. Number one is bicycle theft, though the frequency discussed on social media seems to outpace the number actually reported. Lt. Byrne indicated that, for 2015, there have been 12 bikes reported stolen. He reminded the group that the best way to protect a bike is with a lock, and the best way to track a bike is to get it registered. A registration sticker costs just \$1, and can be obtained at the Team 5 station or at the upcoming Bike Safety Bonanza at Daniel Island School on October 18. "Oftentimes we find bikes, just abandoned," explained Lt. Byrne. "It's a lot easier to get the bikes back to their rightful owners if they have a registration sticker on them." He also commented that, of the three golf carts reported stolen this year, two have been recovered.

As for property theft, the commander told the group that the

last couple of thefts from cars have involved firearms being stolen. "I can't figure out why people keep firearms in their vehicles and don't secure them." said Lt. Byrne. "Please, if you have a firearm, keep it secure, keep it away from children, keep it from getting into the bad guys' hands."

He also indicated that recent thefts from buildings have not involved break-ins because they have been perpetrated by people who have legitimate access to the home or office, such as cleaning services or contract workers. As two final notes, he reported that the City is looking into complaints about – and ways to abate – noise from concerts at Family Circle Cup, and that the consolidated dispatch number has changed to 742-7200.

COUNCILMAN WHITLEY INTRODUCES VITAL INTERSECTION REVISIONS

Berkeley County Councilman Josh Whitley, accompanied by Berkeley County Engineer Carla Harvey, was next to the podium to address proposed improvements to the historically perilous intersection of Seven Farms Drive and Daniel Island Drive. The original plan – to add a turn lane on Daniel Island Drive in front of Daniel Island Academy at a cost of around

\$200,000 – had essentially been scrapped for a new proposal with a broader scope. The alternate plan, which would come with a price tag of more than \$700,000, would include adding a right turn lane on Seven Farms Drive in front of Providence Baptist Church as well as a dedicated left turn lane on Daniel Island Drive in front of Daniel Island Academy, and re-aligning the intersection to alleviate obstruction from the treed median.

"Traffic counts showed that this is a congested intersection... it's graded at an 'E.' If this model is approved, it would go to a well-designed intersection."

If the revised plan moves forward, it would eliminate 15 parking spaces on Seven Farms Drive, primarily used for parking at the two churches. Improvement of the intersection is a listed project on the penny sales tax referendum passed last fall, and construction could start as soon as late spring 2016 with completion targeted for early fall 2016. Residents can view the proposed changes on the DINA website (dicommunity.org) and provide feedback. Harvey also indicated that her team would look into tweaking the timing of the traffic light at the intersection of River Landing Drive and Seven Farms Drive to alleviate 52-feet harbor deepening project. And Sen. Grooms and Rep.

REP. MERRILL AND SEN. GROOMS RUN DOWN SPA LAND TRANSFER

Addressing the crowd on the recent transfer of land from the South Carolina Ports Authority (SCPA) to the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism (PRT) were state Senator Larry Grooms and state Representative Jim Merrill, chair and co-chair, respectively, of the oversight board for the SCPA and 'B," Whitley explained. "E' is a problem, 'B' is a free-flowing, longtime opponents of a Daniel Island-based terminal. The two played a critical role in passing legislation to deny the SCPA the right to build such a facility, rendering the land useful to the acceptable." SCPA only for dredging... and spraying for mosquitoes.

> "But legislation can change," cautioned Sen. Grooms. "We may not be there someday, and someone else could step in. It's very difficult for some people in other parts of the state to understand that the port is not only a great economic asset; there's also a quality of life issue that they don't see."

Spoil cells for dredge material will remain on 900 of the 1,300 acres of SCPA-owned land to accommodate Charleston's

Merrill are working with the Ports Authority to obtain regulatory permission to utilize another portion of the property for a creek restoration and saltwater mitigation bank. But it's a 50-acre parcel that has gotten the attention of Daniel Island residents, heralded by the two state officials as a "win-win-win."

The 99-year lease agreement transfers a portion of land near the Cooper River to the PRT, a strategic move championed by Rep. Merrill. "The Global Gateway (container terminal project) was untenable, for so many reasons," he stated. "To put the largest terminal on the eastern seaboard there without the infrastructure and without any concern for quality of life just wasn't

The project was halted, and moved to the Navy Base where rail already existed, and the Daniel Island land was earmarked for what turned out to be a much-needed dredge disposal site. And then, just announced last month, the transfer of a key 50acre parcel to the state PRT was a strategic move to cut off the SCPA's access in a move to safeguard the Daniel Island land from a future risk of terminal construction.

There are two roads that can access the area – Pierce Street and Seven Farms Drive - but the exact route to what will even-

tually become recreation land will depend upon the ultimate configuration of the parcel. Rep. Merrill indicated that, ideally, the land would be developed into some "active" recreation space, such as ball fields, as well as "passive" recreation opportunity, like hiking trails.

The priority was to get the 50 acres into the hands of the PRT, then transfer it to the most appropriate government authority for development. Rep. Merrill conceded it is too small a parcel to become a state park, but it could potentially be transferred to another entity, such as the City of Charleston, or even the Daniel Island Community Fund.

"There's a tremendous interest from several government entities in seeing this project succeed," replied Sen. Grooms. "And we'll continue to have those discussions as we work with our working group of the Corps of Engineers over what the boundaries are and what's possible. And then once we determine what can happen, then we'll find the right governmental entity that will backfill and actually operate it."

One resident took issue with the fact that Berkeley County would not be a likely contender for development of the project since it does not have a department of recreation. "Maybe it's time for Berkeley County to start a rec department and have this be their first 'shining star' for county parks," she suggested.

Regarding the logic behind transferring the land as a lease versus an outright purchase, Sen. Grooms indicated it had to do with regulations surrounding subdivision of property, and if there had been a deed transfer, the City of Charleston would have had to have meetings to approve a subdivision. This would have delayed the transfer, perhaps several more years.

Though there are still considerable high-level and detailed questions to be resolved, concluded Sen. Grooms: "For today we celebrate that the access has been completely cut off."

FINAL IMPORTANT TIDBITS

Touching on the Daniel Island public boat landing project, Sen. Grooms indicated that the amenity could be finished in as soon as one year. According to the state senator, the funding is in place for the project and the permits are secured, and Berkeley County is currently working out an arrangement with the City of Charleston and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources to move forward.

One final note: Tim Callanan also announced that, as part of Senator Tim Scott's Presidential Town Hall Series, Scott and Representative Trey Gowdy will welcome Florida Governor and GOP Presidential candidate Jeb Bush to speak at Bishop England's Performing Arts Center on October 24 at 9 a.m.

The next DINA meeting will be on November 3 at 7 p.m., with guest speakers South Carolina Ports Authority president and CEO Jim Newsome and Berkeley County School Board member Mac McQuillin.



He proved his value last May in a playoff elimination game against Aynor. He held Aynor scoreless in the top of the seventh and the added a two-run single in the bottom of the inning for a walk-off victory to keep the season alive.

"My goal is to win a state championship in football," Albano said. "All we have to do is stay healthy and execute."

The Bishops lost only four players from last year's baseball team and should be a contender in 2016. The Bishops should be favored to win their first state title since '11. Could he win two state titles?




